OVERLAND - JAVA'S HISTORIC HEARTLAND - WC 2024

Become immersed in Javanese history and culture by visiting Hindu and Buddhist temples, watching artisans forge kris daggers, exploring the Sultan's Palace and strolling Yogyakarta's vibrant, somewhat offbeat shopping district.

Special Note: Any guests travelling with Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC) or CPAP breathing machines should read further below for airline stipulations with regards to bringing this equipment on tour.

DAY 1

After disembarking the ship in Benoa, you will transfer to the airport in Denpasar and fly to the city of Yogyakarta in Java. Upon landing at the Yogyakarta International Airport, you will proceed to the Kali Opak restaurant for lunch, after which you will visit the 9th-century Hindu temple compound of Prambanan.

This impressive collection of temples is dedicated to the Trimurti, a concept of Hinduism in which Brahma is the Creator, Vishnu is the Preserver and Shiva is the Destroyer. They are often referred to as the Great Trinity or Hindu Triad. Easily recognized by its towering and pointed architectural design, the UNESCO World Heritage site of Prambanan is Java's largest Hindu temple complex.

Later in the afternoon, you will transfer to the Hotel Tentrem for check-in and then dinner. The remainder of the evening is yours to spend as you please. The hotel is located in the heart of the city, an easy stroll from the vibrant district of Malioboro.

DAY 2

Setting out before sunrise, you will drive to the stunning temple complex at Borobudur, the largest single Buddhist monument in the world. This UNESCO World Heritage site consists of six square terraces topped by three circular ones. Two million stone blocks were used to build the temple and with an estimated 2,500 relief panels and more than 500 Buddha statues, it is exquisite beyond comparison.

If you wish to watch the sunrise from the temple's highest point, you must climb more than 80 steps. However, many easier-to-access areas also offer wonderful perspectives. After watching the sunrise at the spectacular Buddhist monument and then exploring it further, you will travel to the nearby Manohara resort for breakfast.

Continuing on, you will watch the traditional art of kris-making, a skill that UNESCO recognized as a Masterpiece of Intangible Heritage of Humanity. A kris is an asymmetrical dagger with distinctive blade-patterning from its alternating laminations of iron. It can take a month to forge a single piece.

Krises have been produced throughout Indonesia for centuries, but nowhere is the kris so embedded in the culture as in Central Java. Krises are used for display, as talismans, weapons, sanctified heirlooms, accessories for ceremonial dress, indicators of social status and symbols of heroism. Kris-makers do more than forge the weapon, they perform rituals said to infuse the blade with mystical powers. As such, kris are considered to be vessels of spirits, both good and evil.

Following to your visit to the kris-maker, you will enjoy a traditional lunch before returning to the hotel to freshen up and relax. In time, you will begin an exploration of Yogyakarta that presents a side of the city best known to locals. A longtime resident will accompany you on the tour, which begins with a stroll along Jalan Malioboro, a shopping area with stores open 24 hours a day offering everything from works of art to one-of-a-kind curiosities. Your local expert will provide deeper insights into the culture and assist you with shopping, if you wish.

Jalan Malioboro is known for its unconventional approach to life, and chances are you will see street performers as a warmup to watching a flamboyant cabaret show. In keeping with the theme of being outrageous, you will dine at a restaurant that one of the city's most famous female impersonators owns. A billboard of this beloved local TV star is displayed at the entrance to the restaurant, which is known for its fabulous Javanese and European cuisine.

One last unusual experience awaits you at a square near the palace, which each evening transforms into a weird, loud and chaotic scene of revelry. Enjoy the colorful spectacle of flashy pedal cars and raucous music before returning to the hotel for the evening.

DAY 3

Following breakfast at the hotel, you will tour the Sultan's Palace, which is also known as the Kraton. The innermost group of buildings where the sultan resides were built in 1755. As you meander through the palace, be sure to note the ornate reception halls as well as the large open-air pavilion that was erected so that the sovereign could listen to private performances of traditional gamelan ensemble music.

Other noteworthy features include a museum-like room containing the desk at which one of the sultans planned the overthrow of the Dutch colonialists, and the ornate 'his' and 'hers' entrances decorated with male and female dragons.

Within the grounds of the Kraton, you will also find the Taman Sari, often referred to by its Dutch name of Waterkasteel, which means Water Castle. It was designed in the mid-18th century as a royal pleasure park for the first Sultanate of Yogyakarta and his entourage. It is said that the sultan would sit in the tower and watch the goings-on in the bathing complex while being entertained by his wives.

Next you will visit Kota Gede, a district famous for silver crafting. At a workshop there, you will watch a demonstration of this ancient skill before exploring more craft showrooms in the backstreets of this historic neighbourhood.

Your final visit will be to the Taru Martani cigar factory. Although Java isn't particularly known for cigars, the factory has been operating since 1918 and produces more than a dozen types of cigars. While there, you will learn much about the process, from drying the tobacco leaves through to rolling and preparing them for export.

Afterwards, you will return to the hotel for lunch and check-out before traveling to Tanjung Emas Harbor in Semarang to board your cruise ship.

Expected Weather

Electricity

Voltage in Indonesia is 220 volts, so a transformer will be needed to operate 100-volt appliances. Electrical appliances will require an adapter that can change the shape of the plug prongs, so be sure to bring a universal plug adaptor. Rural areas may only be serviced with 110 volts.

Luggage information for the flight

Luggage allowance is 1 checked suitcase with a maximum weight of 20 kgs/ 44/lbs per person. A small carry-on must fit in the overhead bin or under the seat in front of you.

Carriage of Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC) or CPAP breathing machines on internal flights per airline regulations (subject to change as each airline has their own regulations)

1. Guests must obtain a doctor's certificate mentioning their medical condition and the need to carry this equipment with them on their flights.

2. The certificate should have attached a picture of the equipment with its description/specifications, especially with regards to the type of batteries used (lithium/dry or any other type).

3. These documents must be sent to the Land Program Team via the Reservations Team at least one month prior to travel so that our local operator can begin the notification process with the airline(s).

4. Failure to comply with the above regulations may result in a denial of this equipment at the airport for which the cruise line nor our local ground operator can be responsible for.

Documents and Visa Requirements

A passport that is valid at least 6 months after travel is required. Please check with your local embassy for any visa requirements for your nationality.

VERY IMPORTANT – The name on your cruise booking, passport and any visas if required, must all be exactly the same for flight ticket purchase for this program, otherwise guests may be denied travel by flight. Please ensure that all documents are identical in spelling to the names provided for your cruise reservation including first, middle and last name. DAY 1

This afternoon you will disembark and proceed to the Yangon Airport for a flight to Heho, Inle Lake.

Shan state's prime attraction, Inle Lake is literally dotted with interesting villages and floating gardens and is one of the most picturesque locations in all of Myanmar. The lake and the surrounding area is also home to a number of tribes, mainly Intha but also Shan, Kayah and Danu to name a few and there are fantastic opportunities for browsing at local markets and interacting with the local population.

Nyaung Shwe is the gateway to the lake and upon arrival at Heho airport you will be met and transferred to your hotel for check-in.

Dinner will be served at the hotel.

DAY 2

Following breakfast at the hotel, you will check out and travel to the local market that rotates between villages every five days. It is a great setting to observe daily life among the multi-ethnic residents and see the various types of merchandise that is typically for sale.

Continuing your visit, you will see the five, ancient gold-covered Buddha images at Phaung Daw Oo Pagoda, the holiest monastery on the lake. The images are draped with so much gold leaf that it is actually difficult, if not impossible, to distinguish the original figures.

Other insights into the local culture will be afforded you by watching cigars being hand made in Nampan village and silk being woven in another small village.

After lunch continue sightseeing with a visit to the temple at Nga Hpe Kyaung on the eastern side of the lake, which houses an impressive collection of ancient Buddha images. There will also be the opportunity to visit a floating garden and it goes without saying any visit to the lake would not be complete without witnessing the unique technique of leg rowing which is so synonymous with Intha fisherman.

Then you will transfer to the airport for the flight back to Yangon. Upon arrival, you will transfer to the ship.

NOTE: The schedule for the 5-day market rotation will not be available until nearer the time. If necessary, the order of sightseeing will be changed in order to coincide with a market day. Expected Weather:

March through May is the hottest season with average temperatures ranging from 30 to 35 degrees Celsius (86 to 95 degrees Fahrenheit).

Explore the glorious temples of the Angkor Empire that dense vegetation obscured for centuries, enjoy an evening cruise in a Khmer-style gondola, watch a traditional dance performance and receive a monk's ceremonial blessing.

DAY 1 - March 19, 2024

After disembarking the ship in Singapore, you will transfer to the Singapore Changi Airport and fly to Siem Reap. Upon landing, you will be met and assisted with obtaining your Cambodian Entry Visa. Once this has been issued, you will receive an Angkor Wat temple pass and then continue to the Borei Angkor Resort for check-in.

The remainder of the day will be on your own. If you wish to explore Siem Reap, historical attractions such as the Royal Residence and Angkor National Museum are nearby. There are also plenty of restaurants for dinner on your own or you may choose to dine in the resort.

Day 2 – March 20, 2024

After breakfast at the hotel, you will transfer by tuk tuk to browse a collection of temples that include Srah Srang, Ta Prohm, Ta Nei and Takeo.

Following lunch at a local restaurant, visit the ancient city of Angkor Thom, where you will explore the 12th-century Bayon Temple, the Terrace of the Leper King and the Elephant Terrace, a sandstone wall covered with carved hunting scenes and three-headed elephants.

In the late afternoon, board a Khmer-style gondola and cruise along the moat of the walled city of Angkor Thom. Delight in the peaceful early-evening atmosphere and a magnificent sunset while enjoying drinks and canapés aboard the gondola. You have the option to walk to Prasat Chrung temple, where the views are particularly magical at twilight.

You will then return to the Borei Angkor Resort for the evening and dinner on your own.

Day 3 - March 21, 2024

This morning, you will watch the sunrise at Angkor Wat and explore the archaeological treasures in what was once the mighty Angkor Empire. From there, the kings ruled over a vast territory that extended from the tip of what is now southern Vietnam, northward to Yunnan in China and westward to the Bay of Bengal.

The guide will point out the best spots for taking photos of the massive temple complex, as you walk the cobbled pathways, behold the intricately carved tower tops and climb narrow temple steps that lead to courtyards. Later, as a monk performs a ceremonial blessing, you may gain a greater sense of the complex's spiritual power.

OVERLAND-EGYPT'S RENOWNED RELICS LUXOR & PYRAMIDS

Indulge your senses with some of ancient history's most renowned relics during this scenic and memorable tour of Egypt. The adventure begins with a journey to the world's greatest open-air museum, Luxor City where you will be exploring the beauty and mystery of Egypt's ancient temples and tombs. On the following day, fly to Cairo where your adventure continues with visits to the famous Egyptian Museum of Antiquities, the Great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx.

NOTE: This program involves extensive walking over uneven ground and is thus not suitable for guests with walking difficulties or for those who require a wheelchair.

Special Note: Any guests travelling with Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC) or CPAP breathing machines should read further below for airline stipulations with regards to bringing this equipment on tour.

Day 1

Upon disembarking the ship in Safaga, you will be met by your guide and depart for the 3.5-hour drive to Luxor. Restrooms are available on the coach therefore no stops are planned along the way. Coaches are escorted along the way.

Upon arrival in Luxor the group will enjoy lunch before crossing the fabulous Nile River by motor boat and proceed to the West Bank area for a visit to the Valley of the Kings. It is here you will find the remarkable tombs of Egypt's ancient kings, their families and other Egyptian nobility.

Note: there is a step or two down into the boat, the boat is fully covered but open on the sides.

Ample time is allotted here for you to fully explore this wonderful site. The ticket you receive will include entry to three tombs of your choice. The ground is uneven and there are many steps to enter each of the various tombs.

Next, it's on to Hatshepsut Temple where there will be a short photo stop. This awesome mortuary temple that was buried under sand for centuries was built by Hatshepsut, the only woman to rule as a Pharaoh. Built into the mountainside, it stands as an incredible monument to the powers held by the pharaohs.

A second photo stop follows at the Colossi of Memnon - two massive statues that originally flanked the entrance to Amenhotep III's mortuary temple. Although the temple itself was destroyed in an earthquake and most of its remnants have long since disappeared, these magnificent statues still stand guard today, albeit over an open field.

Finally, a visit will be made to the Luxor Temple. This renowned ancient structure was originally built during the reign of Amenophis the III and then expanded by Ramses II, who added a statue of himself and two obelisks. Today, only one of them remains at the Luxor Temple; the other one was given by Mohamed Ali to Louis Philippe in 1831, and is displayed at the Concorde in Paris to this day. After Alexander the Great rebuilt the sanctuary in the 4th century B.C., the Romans subsequently rebuilt portions of it and the Muslims built a mosque in the temple.

Note: Cameras and video cameras are permitted inside the Luxor Temple. The ground is uneven here.

Following your visit to the Luxor Temple, you will be transferred to your hotel for check-in. In the evening, enjoy a relaxed buffet dinner at your hotel.

Day 2

After an early wake up call, breakfast boxes will be distributed by the hotel before proceeding to the Luxor Airport for a 60-minute flight to Cairo.

Upon arrival in Cairo, considered to be the largest city in Africa and the Middle East, the group will enjoy a buffet breakfast at a deluxe hotel before starting the day's touring.

Your first visit of the day will be the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities. Opened in 1902, the museum has over 107 halls displaying the world's largest and richest collection of Egyptian antiquities, including statues, mummies, the priceless treasures of King Tutankhamen. NOTE: there are steps in the museum

After your museum visit, lunch will be offered in a deluxe restaurant before visiting the only remaining wonders of the Ancient World, the Great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx.

The Giza Plateau consists of three major pyramids or tombs, built by the Pharaohs Cheops, his son Chephren and Chephern's son Mykerinus, where their mummified bodies would rest for eternity.

Situated in front of the pyramids of Chephren, is the guardian of this ancient mortuary complex: the legendary Great Sphinx. This monumental statue, with the body of a lion and head of a human, was carved from a single piece of Giza plateau bedrock and is considered a national symbol of both ancient and modern Egypt.

At each site you will have ample time to walk around and take photos although no inside visits are permitted. Please be aware that there will be vendors selling merchandise and camel rides which you should do only at your own risk.

Following the Pyramids visit, drive back to the Cairo Airport for the flight to Hurghada which is located approximately 60 km away from the port of Safaga. Once you have arrived you will be met and transferred to Safaga where you will re-board the ship.

Visit the 9th-century Hindu temple Prambanan and Borobudur, the world's largest Buddhist temple, before flying off to Borneo for the rare opportunity to watch endangered orangutans and sun bears in protected habitats.

DAY 1 - March 16, 2024

After disembarking the ship in Semarang, you will meet your guide and transfer to Yogyakarta to visit the 9th-century temple Prambanan. The temple is a magnificent piece of architecture adorned with sculptures and reliefs that are considered masterworks of Hindu art.

Unlike many temple complexes, Prambanan was not constructed in a symmetrical manner. The largest of its temples, dedicated to Shiva, rises majestically more than 150 feet into the air and is lavishly carved. If the day is clear, the temple will be silhouetted against the bright blue sky, a sight that is absolutely extraordinary.

Lunch follows at Rumah Sleman, a spectacular lodge, part of which was a home built in 1814 and moved to this location. The traditional Javanese ambiance and exquisite cuisine will make for a delightful dining experience.

After lunch, you will visit Borobudur Temple to watch the sunset, a time when there are fewer visitors. The world's largest Buddhist temple, Borobudur was built during the 8th and 9th centuries. It was constructed in three tiers, the topmost containing 72 openwork stupas, each with a statue of Buddha inside. The guide will describe the construction and significance of Borobudur, a monument so important that UNESCO deemed it a World Heritage site.

Following your visit, you will check into the luxury resort Amanjiwo in the shadow of Borobudur. The remainder of the day will be free to enjoy as you please. Dinner is included at your hotel.

DAY 2 - March 17, 2024

Following breakfast at the hotel, you will check-out and meet the guide that will accompany you to the airport for the flight to Balikpapan on the eastern coast of Borneo. Upon landing, you will transfer to Samboja Lodge, which sits in midst of a rainforest. The lodge was designed in a local architectural style using recycled materials wherever possible and is decorated with handicrafts from the Dayaks, the non-Muslim indigenous people of Borneo.

A foundation dedicated to the survival of Borneo's endangered orangutans created the lodge and nurture the more than 200 orangutans that inhabit the six manmade islands around the grounds. You will have the opportunity to observe the orangutans, as well as the sun bears that live in a sanctuary near the lodge.

The animals are fed fruits, vegetables and leafy branches from the surrounding rainforest. To help ensure the sustainability of their food supply, you will help plant a fruit tree in a suitable location.

Later, you will enjoy dinner at Samboja Lodge and spend an evening in the wonderfully harmonious setting.

DAY 3 - March 18, 2024

OVERLAND - TIGERS AND THE PINK CITY - MARCH 2024

Gain an extraordinary perspective of the gorgeous Pink City of Jaipur through its architectural highlights and observe iconic wildlife such as Bengal tigers on game drives in a national park.

Special Note: Guests travelling with Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC), CPAP breathing machines or scooters should read further below for airline stipulations with regards to bringing this equipment on tour.

Day 1 — March 30, 2024

After disembarking the ship in Cochin and attending to immigration and customs formalities, you will visit some of the city highlights before proceeding to the airport.

There, you will receive a box lunch, pass through security and then fly to Jaipur via Bangalore, arriving in the late afternoon. Jaipur is the capital of the desert-like state of Rajasthan, a land rich in legends of romance, chivalry, sacrifice and heroic deeds.

You will spend the evening and dine at the Jai Mahal Palace, the former residence of the Prime Minister. Its graceful architecture is uniquely Rajput, with cupolas, minarets and arched doorways. Open-air verandahs spill out onto lovely grounds where peacocks strut.

Day 2 — March 31, 2024

Following breakfast, explore the Pink City, where an enduring charisma of the past blends with the throbbing vitality of today. The scholar and astronomer Jai Singh founded Jaipur centuries ago, and it is considered India's first planned city. It is often called the Pink City for the predominant color of its buildings.

Among the highlights is Amber Fort, former seat of the Rajput rulers of Jaipur. There, you may wander through the exquisite palaces and visit Shiladevi temple, the private temple of the royal family. Its marble carvings and silver door are spectacular.

Continuing to old Jaipur, you will visit the Hawa Mahal or the Palace of Winds, a fine example of Rajput artistry. It is constructed of red and pink sandstone, beautifully outlined with white borders and motifs painted with quick lime.

You will then head toward the City Palace, a sprawling structure surrounded by a high wall. The royal family lives in a portion of the palace. Other areas have been converted into museums displaying textiles, costumes, paintings and carpets.

Across from the palace, you will find the open-air royal observatory Jantar Mantar, an esteemed World Heritage site. Jai Singh ordered its construction in the 18th century. It contains the world's largest stone sundial, among other astronomical instruments.

Return to the hotel for a late lunch after which you will have a 3.5 hour drive through the countryside to the famous tiger sanctuary at Ranthambore. Your stay here is at Taj Sawai Madhopur Lodge, former tiger hunting retreat of the Maharaja of Jaipur.

Dinner and overnight at Taj Sawai Madhopur Lodge.

Day 3 - April 1, 2024

Coffee, tea and rolls are served at dawn before proceeding on a drive through the park in a Jeep or canter safari vehicle with expert naturalists. They will point out and describe the great diversity of birds, mammals and major predators.

The deep gorges of Ranthambore serve as hideouts for animals such as leopards, tigers and sloth bears. The forest also provides a natural habitat for spotted deer and sambar, the largest Asiatic deer. Woodland, ground and water birds are plentiful, including red junglefowl. Although Ranthambore was once a hunting ground for Bengal tigers, it has become a research and conservation area for these magnificent animals, especially in the last decade or so.

The 10th-century Ranthambore Fort that overlooks the reserve is so historically important that UNESCO deemed it a World Heritage site. You may notice various animals resting on its ancient ramparts.

Return to the resort for breakfast and a morning at leisure.

In the afternoon, you may choose to visit Dastkar, an extraordinary center for crafts, the majority of them created by women as their sole means of income. The bazaar at Dastkar helps the local villagers become self-reliant, as the craftspeople sell their products independent of a commercial middleman. You will view them creating a huge variety of traditional items by hand.

Later in the afternoon, you will enjoy a second game drive, exploring yet another area of the national park with a naturalist guide.

Dinner follows at the lodge, where you will spend the evening.

OVERLAND - AJANTA AND ELLORA CAVES - 2024

Fly to Aurangabad to explore India's most extraordinary cave temples carved out of sheer rock—the caves of Ajanta, where Buddhist monks once lived, and the Ellora Caves, which three different religious groups occupied.

Special Note: Any guests travelling with Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC) or CPAP breathing machines should read further below for airline stipulations with regards to bringing this equipment on tour.

Due to the amount of walking, at times on uneven surfaces, this program is not recommended for anyone with walking difficulty or if a cane, walker or wheelchair are used.

Day 1 – Saturday, March 30

After disembarking the ship in Cochin, you will transfer to the airport for a flight to Mumbai. En-route you will have a city tour of Cochin and lunch at a local hotel. Your bags will be transported to the airport in a separate baggage van for an advance check-in.

Upon arrival in Mumbai, you will be met and transferred to your hotel for the evening. Dinner is included.

Day 2 - Sunday, March 31, 2024

Early in the morning, a light continental breakfast is served in the lobby prior to transferring to the airport for a flight to Aurangabad.

After breakfast, drive into the countryside towards the Ajanta Caves. In the early 19th Century, a group of British officers accidentally came upon these caves, which were buried under debris and screened by foliage. The first of these caves was hollowed out from the site of the cliff in the 2nd century B.C.

Strung out in a sweeping horseshoe shape in an inner fold of the hills, the caves were a secluded retreat for Buddhist monastic orders and yet offered easy access to the trade routes that swung past here to the coast. With little more than hammers and chisels, the monks painstakingly and slowly created underground shrines, chapels and monasteries, where they lived, taught and carried out ritual performances. The 30 caves of Ajanta, some unfinished, span a period of 800 years and contain numerous images of the Buddha.

A packed lunch prepared by your hotel is served before returning to the hotel.

The evening is at leisure with an option to revisit the Aurangabad town.

Dinner is included at your hotel

Day 3 - Monday, April 1, 2024

After breakfast at your hotel, you drive into the picturesque hills to the north and visit the Ellora Caves. This magnificent UNESCO World Heritage site contains 34 Hindu, Jain and Buddhist caves cut into volcanic lava cliffs.

The once-abandoned, more than 2,000-year-old caves lie near an ancient trade route and are believed to be the work of priests and craftsmen who used the route. The carvings, ornamentation and frescoes inside tell the stories of how these three religions evolved.

The most marvelous cave temple is Kailash. The world's largest monolithic sculpture, it was sculpted out of a rock by 7,000 laborers over a 150-year period. The story of its construction is inscribed on the copper plate grant of King Krishna I, under whose patronage the temple was carved. Architecturally and sculpturally, art historians consider this to be the finest cave temple in the world.

Following your exploration of the Ellora Caves, you will return to the hotel for lunch and some time at leisure.

In the afternoon visit the revered Bibi Ka Maqbara tomb, known as the Black Taj because it is so similar to the Taj Mahal in Agra. Also visit a Himroo weaving workshop, where fine shawls, sarees and textiles are produced. Himroo merchandise was originally woven with pure gold and silver threads for royal families.

Upon returning to the hotel, dinner in included.

Note on walking and steps:

Ajanta Caves are carved into the side of a hill range. From the bottom, it takes 105 steps to get to the top which is typically an easy climb for anyone without walking difficulty. Once at the top, there is a gradual walk from one cave to the next. For guests with difficulties, our local operator can arrange Palanquins (a conveyance usually for one person that consists of an enclosed litter borne on the shoulders of men by means of poles) up and down as well as from one cave to the next, if necessary.

Ellora Caves are on ground level over a spread-out area. Battery buses shuttle between caves. The only place where a climb is encountered is at the Kailash Temple where there are easy steps however once again those with walking difficulties can be carried up and down.

Day 4 - Tuesday, April 2, 2024

OVERLAND - THE INSIDERS JAVA - 2024

Experience Java like an insider by exploring fascinating places that most visitors rarely see, including Mount Bromo at sunrise and a former slum that volunteers transformed into a vibrant community full of hope.

Special Note: Any guests travelling with Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC) or CPAP breathing machines should read further below for airline stipulations with regards to bringing this equipment on tour.

DAY 1

After disembarking the ship in Benoa, you will transfer to the airport in Denpasar and fly to the city of Surabaya in Java. Upon landing at the Juanda International Airport, you will transfer to the Plataran Bromo hotel, stopping along the way for lunch.

You will have time to settle in and freshen up at the hotel before dinner and spending the evening.

Tucked away in the highlands of East Java, Plataran Bromo offers sublime views overlooking a patchwork of agricultural plantations woven into the surrounding hillsides. The hotel is conveniently located at the gateway of Bromo Tengger Semeru National Park – a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DAY 2

After waking up about 3am, you will travel by private 4WD jeep to the rim of Mount Penanjakan, which soars more than 9,000 feet above sea level. From there, you will watch the sunrise over the active volcano Mount Bromo. At 2,329 meters above sea level, Mount Bromo is one of the most iconic sights in Java, standing as the centerpiece of Bromo Tengger Semeru National Park. You can expect it to be a glorious experience as the surrounding countryside takes on an almost mystical appearance as the sunlight slowly illuminates it.

In the background, you will see Mount Semeru, another active volcano with the distinction of being the highest point in Java. Although its eruptions are small, they are almost constant. Chances are, you will see plumes of ash rising from the volcano and perhaps even the glow from lava flows inching down the mountainside.

After sunrise, you will descend the steep slopes of Mount Penanjakan, cross a plain known as the Sea of Sand and arrive at a verdant savannah. It is an idyllic setting, where you can sit on a picnic blanket and enjoy an al fresco breakfast. You will be surrounded by the magical landscape of the Bromo Tengger Semeru National Park.

Once you finish breakfast, you will drive back to Mount Bromo for a short walk of easy to medium difficulty that will take you to the base of the mountain. As an option at an additional cost, you might cross the Sea of Sand on horseback.

Upon returning to the hotel, you will check-out and head for Malang, stopping along the way for lunch. Just east of the city, in the village of Jago, you will find Jajaghu Temple. It was completed at the beginning of the 14th century and embraces elements of Hinduism and Buddhism. The temple is said to contain the ashes of the fourth king of the Singosari kingdom.

After visiting the temple, you will check into the Hotel Tugu Malang for the evening and enjoy dinner there.

DAY 3

Following breakfast at the hotel, you will visit Jodipan Village, which until 2016 was a slum so horrific that the local government considered re-locating the entire population to a more humane place. The situation inspired a group of local university students to give Jodipan a new and improved look by painting the village. Three tons of paint were donated and local artists, village residents and even troops from the Indonesian Air Force soon began transforming Jodipan.

Now nicknamed Kampung Warna-Warni, which translates to "colorful hometown," the village is divided into two parts, separated by the Brantas River. While initially only the houses along the south bank were painted, it wasn't long before the houses on the other side of the river were painted, many of them in a 3D look.

Today, a pedestrian bridge connects the two sections of Jodipan. It features brightly colored walls and illustrations of Javanese cultural images such as shadow puppets and characters from animated Hollywood movies. The improved look of Jodipan attracted tourists, the economy started to grow and the residents felt a sense of hope and optimism for the first time in years.

The head of the village, known as the Rukun Warga, will provide you with deeper insights about the village's transformation while you enjoy tea or coffee in a café. In time, you will meander through Jodipan's narrow winding streets to a studio for artists that worked on the transformation. They will show you how to create artwork with a Javanese flair.

After visiting, you will drive to Tanjung Perak Cruise Terminal in Surabaya and board your cruise ship.

Bagan was one of the first capitals of an ancient Burmese empire and, today, is one of the world's major heritage sites. Fly to ancient Bagan to behold its seemingly countless pagodas and temples, most of them constructed between the 11th and 13th centuries, when the Kingdom of Pagan was at the height of its power.

DAY 1

This afternoon you will disembark proceed to the Yangon Airport for a flight to Bagan.

Known as the city of four million pagodas, Bagan is one of the richest archaeological sites in Asia. Here today, you can find over 2,000 pagodas, temples and monasteries that remain and built during the Bagan Dynasty founded by King Anawrahta in 1044A.D.

Arriving in Bagan you will be met and transferred from the airport to your hotel for check-in.

Dinner will be served at the hotel.

DAY 2

Following breakfast and check out at your hotel, your day of the sightseeing will begin with a panoramic view from one of the view-points where you can see hundreds of temples stretch across the plain (your guide will choose the best location according to the season).

Continue your tour with a visit to the well-preserved Shwezigone Pagoda. Commenced by Anawrahta in the 12th century but completed by his son, King Kyansittha, it is a prototype for many later Myanmar pagodas. Its distinctive gilded zedi dominates the small town of Nyaung-U. This impressive pagoda contains 4 shrines at the cardinal points, each housing a 13ft high bronze standing Buddha, the largest surviving examples in Bagan.

Next you will proceed to the amazing Ananda Temple (via pony cart ride - can be bumpy) which is one of the four main temples remaining in Bagan. Ananda temple is one of the last surviving masterpieces of the Mon architecture. It is also known as the finest, largest, best preserved and most revered of the Bagan temples.

Continue to visit the Law Ka Nandar monastery and participate in a food donation ceremony. After the ceremony, you are invited to tour the monastery and learn of the daily lives of the monks and novices who reside there.

Enjoy lunch at one of Bagan's finest restaurants. Before lunch, the chef will demonstrate the preparation of a few traditional Myanmar delights. You are welcome to participate in their making which will then be enjoyed as your own dessert.

After lunch, transfer to a local lacquer-ware workshop where you will be welcomed by the locals with a U Shwe Yoe & Daw Moe dance performance. Here you will observe the art of Bagan lacquer-ware being created. Bagan is not only famous for the profusion of pagodas but also for its artistic handicrafts and local lacquer-ware store where the process of making each piece can be seen.

Continue to visit Gubyaukgyi with its excellent stucco carvings. After this extensive day of sightseeing you will be transferred to the Bagan Airport for the flight back to Yangon.

Upon arrival in Yangon transfer to the ship.

Home to eight of the world's 10 tallest peaks, the tiny kingdom of Nepal is ringed by the Himalayas. It is a land of contrasts, harboring a wealth of Buddhist and Hindu art and architecture. Nepal's colorful capital city Kathmandu reflects 2,000 years of peaceful co-existence and exudes a unique blend of Hinduism and Buddhism, which is distinctly Nepalese in character.

Nepal has eight World Heritage sites and has won two Heritage Awards, one for the city of Bhaktapur and the other for the Dwarika's Hotel, where you will spend the evening.

Described as a "living, breathing museum, displaying Nepal's best craftsmanship from the 13th century," the hotel rooms and public areas at Dwarika's Hotel reflect medieval architectural traditions. Every brick is handmade, every piece of wood original and centuries old.

Day 2 - March 31, 2024

Early in the morning, you will transfer to the airport for a flight-seeing excursion (weather permitting), soaring over glacierclad, cloud-shrouded peaks and other landscapes around Mount Everest. Afterwards, you will return to the hotel for breakfast.

Following breakfast, you will have some time at leisure and before noon you will drive to the Traditional Inn in Patan for lunch. After lunch you will visit Patan, one of three royal cities in the valley. Commissioned by India's great emperor Ashoka in the 3rd century, this World Heritage Site within four stupas is known as the City of Fine Arts.

The temples around the main square are impressive as is the Patan Museum, which is housed within a picturesque palace setting. In an international campaign by UNESCO for safeguarding monuments in Kathmandu Valley, the Austrian government joined hands with Nepal to restore and preserve Patan.

Newari architectural style blossomed in the form of temples, palaces, residences and squares between the 12th and 18th centuries, representing a timelessness in Nepalese architecture and its definitive characteristics, often guided by religious and socio-cultural norms.

You will enjoy a cup of tea in a 150-year-old restored Newari home. Its ground level is for daily activities and storage, while the floors above contain living spaces and bedrooms. The top floor serves as the family shrine and cooking and dining area.

Next, you will see Patan's Living Goddess, who typically acknowledges greetings of devotees from the balcony of her temple residence. Known as kumaris, Nepal's living goddesses live in seclusion and rarely speak in public.

After a private audience with the goddess it's on to the Singing Bowl workshops. According to the oral traditions, singing bowls were brought to Nepal from India in the 8th century along with Buddha's teachings. The Nepalese were expert bronze makers which allowed them to perfect these bowls which are commonly used as a tool for meditation. The beautiful rich tones the bowls produce are thought to help achieve a state of deep relaxation.

There's time for individual exploration before departing for Thamel - Kathmandu's hip street. Pulsating Thamel has become a world address for international trekkers, mountaineers and curio shoppers looking for a bargain.

Transfer to and enjoy drinks and dinner at a local favorite "Sam's One Tree Café". Following dinner the group returns to the hotel for the evening.

After breakfast, you will drive to the World Heritage city of Bhadgaon, also known as Bhaktapur. Founded in the 9th century, Bhaktapur, also known as the City of Devotees, is revered for its medieval art and architecture. As you meander around Durbar Square, you will see the 55 Window Palace and Nyatapola temple, considered to be the finest example of Pagoda-style architecture.

Following lunch at Kathmandu's popular Chez Caroline Café, you will return to the hotel.

Later, you will visit the great Stupa at Bodhnath, one of the largest of its kind in the world. Constructed in the 14th century, the stupa is built on an octagonal base, inset with prayer wheels. Bodhnath is also a center of the Tibetan community in Nepal, where you will visit a monastery and interact with a senior monk. A visit is also made to the Thangka Painting Studio, which renowned artist Lok Chitrakar founded. The sacred art form of Thangkas is a visual interpretation of Buddhist and Hindu philosophies that date from before the 7th century C.E.

You will then visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Pashupatinath, one of the holiest Hindu temples and a major pilgrimage site dedicated to the god Shiva. Situated within a natural setting on the bank of the sacred Bagmati River, the temple features a pagoda style, a gilded roof and a richly carved silver door.

After watching the Aarti prayer offering ceremony at the temple, you will return to the hotel to spend the evening. Dinner is included at your hotel.

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel and the morning is at leisure.

In memory of his wife, the great Mughal emperor Shah Jehan planned this most extravagant and incomparable monument built for love. Although amazingly graceful from any angle, it is the close-up detail, which is really astounding. At sunset, the monument appears to change its hue, tinted by the glow of the setting sun.

Back at your hotel, and after some time to freshen up, enjoy the classical dance form of Kathak in the ballroom. A buffet dinner follows the dance performance.

Day 3 - April 1, 2024

Experience the best of vibrant Phnom Penh by visiting museums and the royal palace before flying to Angkor Wat for a comprehensive tour of its massive, 12th-century temple complex and Angkor Thom, the last Khmer capital.

Special Note: Guests travelling with Portable Oxygen Concentrators (POC) or CPAP breathing machines should read further below for airline stipulations with regards to bringing this equipment on tour.

DAY 1: Tuesday March 19, 2024

Disembark from the ship in Singapore with your luggage and then proceed with immigration clearance and security check. Our representative will meet you by the Cruise Centre Arrival Hall and assist you in transferring to the Changi Airport for the flight to Phnom Penh.

Included in the program is a fast track and express Cambodia visa service upon arrival at Phnom Penh International Airport. Guests must complete all forms (Visa on Arrival, Arrival/Departure card and Passenger Declaration forms), which will be distributed on board the aircraft or will be available in the arrivals hall at the airport. An airport representative will welcome guests as they enter the arrivals hall. The representative will collect each guest's passport and a passport-size photo and proceed to process the visa. Please make sure to bring a passport sized photo in your carryon bag.

The group will fast track through immigration and collect luggage while the visas are being processed, then proceed to meet your guide and driver, who will be waiting outside the terminal in the main meet-and-greet area. Our airport representative will return the passports once the visas are processed.

Transfer to the historical Raffles Hotel Le Royal, where you will stay in a Colonial Suite. This luxurious hotel opened in 1929 and is renowned for its extraordinary service and amenities. You will have time to freshen up before the evening's foodie experience: an Urban Forage Market and BBQ tour that combines exotic street food and lively nightlife.

You will travel from place to place by tuk tuk. Accompanied by a local guide, you will explore a market, interact with vendors and sample the very best Cambodian street food. A traditional dinner will then be served at a nearby restaurant with live music from the 1960s. If time permits, you will stop elsewhere for dessert before returning to the hotel. Should you choose, you may wish to continue on your own to one of Phnom Penh's trendy late-night spots.

DAY 2: Wednesday March 20, 2024

Following breakfast at the hotel, you will visit the Toul Sleng Genocide Museum, a former high school that became a notorious prison and torture chamber during the Pol Pot regime. After being interrogated, prisoners were often transferred to the infamous Killing Fields to be executed. Browsing the museum is a sobering experience.

You will then visit the Royal Palace, which was built in 1866 by King Norodom. The palace consists of a number of structures within a pagoda-style compound. The Silver Pagoda is so named because of its floor, which is made up of 5,000 silver tiles. Its treasures include a solid-gold Buddha encrusted with thousands of diamonds and a small 17th-century emerald and Baccarat crystal Buddha.

Continuing on, you will next browse the National Museum. It houses an abundance of Khmer art that includes sculptures from different periods of Cambodian history, 19th-century dance costumes and royal barges.

Lunch follows, after which you will return to the hotel for check-out and then transfer to the Phnom Penh airport for the flight to Siem Reap. Upon arrival, you will check into a Junior Suite at the elegant Sofitel Angkor Phokeethra Golf & Spa Resort. Ideally located just 10 minutes from Angkor Wat, the French Colonial-influenced hotel couldn't be more luxurious.

After settling in and freshening up, you will depart for dinner at the Chanrey Tree restaurant. Afterwards, you will watch Phare, The Cambodian Circus, a highly entertaining show featuring circus-like performers that relate uniquely Cambodian stories and experiences. The show's dancers, singers, musicians and acrobats put on an incredibly enthusiastic, high-energy performance that you will not soon forget.

Day 3: Thursday, March 21, 2024

The day begins early at Angkor Wat, where you will watch a magnificent sunrise over the enormous Buddhist temple complex, which was built in the 12th century as a Hindu temple. It is considered the world's largest religious monument.

After sunrise, you will enjoy a traditional Khmer breakfast at Sala Kdei, a beautiful traditional wooden house overlooking the royal bathing pool of Sras Srang.

You will then return to Angkor Wat by entering through the serene east gate, which reveals that Angkor Wat is oriented to east unlike every other Cambodian temple, which is oriented to the west. Angkor Wat was conceived by Suryavarman II and took 30 years to build. It supposedly contains an amount of stone that is equal to that used to construct the Egyptian pyramid of Cheops. Be sure to notice the intricate bas-reliefs on all sides of the temple, as each one tells a different story.

You will also have the opportunity to receive a personal blessing from a monk at the temple. This traditional Khmer ceremony involves a sprinkling of water and lotus flowers to cleanse you of bad spirits and bring good luck for the coming year. Chances are, you will feel renewed and relaxed after the ceremony.

Note: to enter the sacred Bakan tower at Angkor Wat, visitors must wear proper attire that covers the shoulders and knees. Shorts, miniskirts or short trousers are not allowed. Children under 12 years old may not climb the tower.

Following your time at Angkor Wat, you will return to the hotel for lunch before continuing on to Angkor Thom, the last capital of the Khmers. Your exploration begins at the Terrace of the Leper King. This intricately carved platform was the royal crematorium and the statue that was originally thought to be the leper king is now believed to be Yama, the god of death.

You will continue along the Terrace of Elephants, a viewing gallery where the king once presided over parades, performances and sporting events. You will also view the grand temple of The Bayon, a 12th-century archaeological wonder at the very center of Angkor Thom. Its exterior gallery walls are covered with bas-reliefs and adorned with hundreds of enigmatic half-smiling faces.

Another highlight is the 12th-century Ta Prohm, the only temple that wasn't fully cleared of jungle vegetation after French explorers found it in the late 1880s. Giant silk-cotton trees and strangler figs grow in and atop the temple's stone ruins, making for a dramatic setting.

Before returning to Siem Reap, you will stop at the Apopo, a fascinating research center. There, a special breed of rat with an extraordinary sense of smell is trained to detect landmines so they can be safely removed from rural areas after the military conflicts in the area have ended. The rats don't weigh enough to set off the landmines and are never in harm's way. This behind-the-scenes experience will give you the opportunity to observe the rats clearing a mock mine field and talk with their trainers.

The highly valued rats are well treated. They enjoy spacious, cool lodgings, are fed plenty of fresh fruit and never work for longer than a few hours a day. The even have sunscreen carefully applied to their ears and tails to protect their skin while on duty. The rats typically retire after four years of service.

In time, you will return to the hotel to freshen up before the evening's culinary immersion, which offers a taste of Khmer fusion cuisine at three different restaurants. An English-speaking tuk tuk driver will take you from one venue to the other over a period of about three hours. You can expect to enjoy a starter and welcome drink at the first restaurant, a main course and drink at the second, and a dessert and drink at the third venue.

Day 4: Friday March 22, 2024

After breakfast and check out from the hotel, you will transfer to the airport for the flight to Phuket via Bangkok.

Upon arrival in Phuket, you will drive to the port and re-board the cruise ship.

OVERLAND - THE JEWELS OF LUXOR 2022-24

Explore the beauty and mystery of Egypt's ancient temples and tombs during this memorable journey to Luxor. Along the way, you will visit the Karnak, Luxor and Hatshepsut Temples, Colossi of Memnon, and both the Valley of the Kings and Queens.

Day 1

Upon disembarking the ship in Safaga, you will be met and depart for the 3.5-hour drive to Luxor.

Upon arrival you will enjoy lunch and then visit the Karnak temple.

Located about two miles north of the Luxor Temple, but connected to it by an impressive avenue of sphinxes, the Karnak Temple was the most important sanctuary of ancient Egypt, and the heart of the cult of the god Amon. Each pharaoh added his own contribution to the temple over the ensuing 2,000 years.

The Ptolemies erected the massive first pylon you will see. Past the second pylon, which is guarded by a pair of huge statues of Ramses II, you will find the great hypo-style hall, the largest hall of any temple in the world. It spans 50,000 square feet and contains 134 enormous columns. You may notice that some of the columns still have traces of the brilliant paint that originally covered them. The third pylon leads to the center court, and past the fourth pylon is the 97-foot-high obelisk of Queen Hatshepsut, carved from a solid piece of pink granite.

As you pass through successive pylons and courts, you will journey back in time until you reach the oldest part of the temple, built by the pharaohs of the middle kingdom around 2000 B.C. At the south end of the temple, you will find the sacred lake where ceremonial boats took part in the worship of Amon.

NOTE: Cameras and video cameras are permitted inside the Karnak Temple free of charge.

Following Karnak Temple visit you will visit the Luxor Temple, which was originally built during the reign of Amenophis the III and then expanded by Ramses II, who added a statue of himself and two obelisks.

Today, only one of the statues remains at the Luxor Temple; Mohamed Ali gave the other one to Louis Philippe in 1831 and it is displayed at the Concorde in Paris. After Alexander the Great rebuilt the sanctuary in the 4th century B.C., the Romans subsequently rebuilt portions of it, and then the Muslims built a mosque in the temple.

NOTE: Cameras and video cameras are permitted inside the Luxor Temple.

Transfer to your hotel for check in before departing for a visit to the Luxor Museum. This marvelous museum overlooks the west bank of the Nile River and has an amazing collection of ancient artifacts. Displays range from magnificent pharaonic art to items used in everyday life, such as pottery and jewelry, including a carefully selected assortment of items from the Theban temples and necropolis.

Back at your hotel, enjoy a buffet dinner before retiring for the evening.

Day 2

Following a buffet breakfast, you will cross over the Nile to the West Bank to visit the Valley of the Kings, hidden in the foothills of the Gourma Mountains. More than 60 tombs of pharaohs and noblemen have been excavated in this valley. The kings' formal names and titles are inscribed in their tombs, along with their images and statues. Between the 18th and 20th dynasties, the kings abandoned the Memphis area and built their tombs in Thebes.

Enjoy a special visit to the longest and one of the most beautiful tombs in the valley known as Seti I Tomb. It is still recognized as an elaborately decorated monument from the times of Sety I and his son, Ramesses II. The most fascinating aspects of the tomb are the well-crafted decorations that brought antiquity to vivid life

Next you will visit King Tutankhamun's tomb where his mummy still rests, and if time permits, you may be able to have a look into one or two other tombs in the area.

Continuing on, enjoy a photo stop at the Hatshepsut Temple, whose unique design features a series of grand terraces extending up a cliff with rows of square granite columns blending in with the mountainside.

From here, you will proceed for a visit to Valley of the Queens where you will be visiting Queen Nefertari's Tomb known for its lavish decoration and colors – it is one of the largest and most spectacular in the Valley of the Queens. Nefertari Meritmut, was an Egyptian queen and the first of the Great Royal Wives (or principal wives) of Ramesses the Great. The number of visitors here per day is limited and prior permission to visit must be requested. This has been specially arranged for our group.

NOTE: there are a series of steps (up to 20 steps per chamber) to go down into the various tombs and the ground surrounding the tombs is uneven and dusty. It is also extremely hot here.

Cameras and video cameras may be used during your visit, but are not permitted inside the tombs.

Next, a photo stop will be made at the Colossi of Memnon. This structure was originally built as a mortuary temple in Thebes and guarded by two gigantic statues on the outer gates. All that remains today are the 75-foot-high, 1,000-ton statues of Amenhotep III. Though damaged by nature and ancient tourists, the statues are still impressive nonetheless. NOTE: Cameras and video cameras are permitted free of charge.

Finally you will embark on a Dahabeya boat for a cruise along the Nile including lunch. Arriving at your hotel, you will check-out and depart for the 3.5-hour drive back to Safaga. Upon arrival, you will proceed directly to the pier and reembark the ship.

DAY 1 - May 2, 2024

After disembarking the ship in Barcelona, you will meet the tour guide that will accompany you throughout this overland program. A short transfer will bring you to the Sants train station, where you will board the AVE high-speed train for a picturesque, 3.5-hour journey to Madrid. A box lunch will be provided, and cafeteria service is available on the train.

Upon arriving in the capital, you will settle in for a panoramic drive down streets such as Gran Via, which is lined with early 20th-century architecture. Other sights may include the Parliament House and Puerta del Sol, Madrid's historical and geographical heart.

The walking portion of the tour will begin with a stroll through Plaza de España, where you will view the Don Quixote monument. Check-in at the Meliá Madrid Princesa hotel and time to relax follows, after which you will travel to a nearby venue for a tapas dinner and passionate flamenco performance.

The remainder of the evening will be spent at your leisure at the hotel.

DAY 2 - May 3, 2024

After breakfast and check out from the hotel, you will travel to Toledo, a city so architecturally rich that Spain has declared it a national monument. While walking through Toledo, the guide will point out the various styles of architecture, including Arabian, Jewish, Mudéjar, Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque. You will have the opportunity to explore the interior of the synagogue of Santa Maria La Blanca. Constructed in 1180 in the Mudéjar style, it features 32 pilasters and five naves.

Toledo was the capital of Spain from the Gothic epoch until 1560 and much of the architecture from that time has been beautifully preserved. The streets are so atmospheric that it is easy to imagine what it was like there in the Middle Ages.

Continuing on, you will drive to Cordoba, stopping for lunch along the way. Once in town, you will begin a panoramic drive of Cordoba that passes the Roman bridge, the royal palaces and the Calahorra Tower. Following check in at the Soho Boutique Cordoba hotel, you will have time to relax before dinner at a nearby restaurant.

You will then overnight at the Soho Boutique Cordoba.

DAY 3 - May 4, 2024

After breakfast and check out from the hotel, you will tour more of Cordoba, a UNESCO World Heritage site hailed for its extraordinary architecture. Highlights include browsing the magnificent Great Mosque, which is now the Catholic cathedral, and strolling through the former Jewish Quarter.

You will then drive to the small town of Montilla and visit Bodega Alvear, one the oldest wine cellars in Andalusia, as it was founded in 1729. There, you will see how sherry is produced and enjoy a sampling of it with snacks.

Following lunch at a nearby restaurant, you will continue on to Ronda, a dramatically picturesque city perched atop two sheer cliffs that form the El Tajo canyon. Over time, the Guadalevín River carved the deep, incredibly photogenic canyon out of the rock. Many of the buildings were constructed right on the edges of the cliffs, and three ancient stone bridges provide the only means to travel from one side of the city to the other.

After checking into the hotel in Ronda, the remainder of the day will be at your leisure with dinner on your own.

DAY 4 - MAY 5, 2024

Following breakfast at the hotel and check-out, you will follow a guide through Ronda on an eye-opening walking tour. The Plaza de Toros may be the highlight as it was completed in 1785, making it the oldest bullring in Spain. Bullfighting aficionados such as Ernest Hemingway and Orson Welles have watched some of Spain's most legendary toreadors fight there, and original paintings by Malaga-born Picasso adorn the interior walls.

The Church of Santa Maria la Mayor is another landmark, and to see it you will cross over El Tajo canyon. The earthquake of 1580 destroyed much of the first church built on the site, and the renovated version that stands today features a beautiful blend of Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque architectural elements.

After the walking tour, guests participating in the World Cruise Event will transfer to Malaga. The rest of the group will enjoy lunch at the Parador Hotel before heading to Malaga. During the brief city tour that follows, those guests will pause for photos at the magnificent, 10th-century Gibralfaro Castle and then rejoin the ship.
